

Coaching Report

The Shooting Federation of Canada is very pleased to announce the release of the new National Coach Certification Program. The new program will consist of three contexts: Instructor Beginner which replaces the old level one, Competition Development which replaces the old level two and three combined and Competition High Performance which will replace levels four and five.

Instructor Beginner is complete in all three disciplines; Rifle, Pistol and Shotgun. Since meeting approval from the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC), we have trained the following Shooting Federation of Canada members:

We have also received approval for Competition Development for Rifle and Pistol. A Rifle pilot course was run this spring with 16 participants including facilitators receiving credit for attending from the CAC. We are currently in the final stages of completing the Competition Development module for Shotgun with a planned finish date of December 2016. In addition, we are beginning to plan a possible Master Coach Developer training session for all three disciplines sometime in February of 2017.

Through the SFC's Provincial/Territorial affiliates, Instructor Beginner courses are being offered this fall in Whitehorse Yukon, Calgary Alberta, Victoria British Columbia and in St. John's Newfoundland.
