RULES AND REGULATIONS

The 2022 Canadian International Skeet Shooting National Championships will be conducted according to the current ISSF Rules and Regulation. Detailed information is available on the ISSF website www.issf-sports.org.

The **Jury reserves the right to make exceptions to the Rules as and when necessary**. All changes will be announced in writing and posted at the range clubhouse. The Chief Range Officer (Equipment Control, Classification and Appeals) are designated by the Shotgun Section to supervise the 2022 Canadian International Skeet Shooting Championships and major officials will hold a valid ISSF Referee Licence [ISSF A level Shotgun Judge or (2) ISSF Officials /ISSF Referee and/or ISSF B level Shotgun Judge]

The Chief Range Officer will coordinate with the match director to select an appropriate number of jury members. Selected jury members should be familiar with the ISSF shooting rules and be an experienced athlete, official and/or competition staff.

The Shotgun Jury will verify with the match director that the targets and equipment used for the competition are in working order and that the targets are set according to the current ISSF Rules and Regulations.

All competitors are expected to serve as sideline referees. If scheduled to shoot the next round, there will be a 10 minute break between flanking and shooting. If an athlete fails to act as a sideline referee when he/she is required to do so, they shall be penalized as per ISSF Rules. An up-to-date program schedule (with changes to time or added information) will be posted in the clubhouse prior to the match.

Equipment

All shooting equipment must comply with current ISSF shooting rules. **Equipment control will be available to competitors on the day of Pre Event Training (PET)**. Mainly to ensure skeet marker tape is compliant with ISSF Rules 9.10.41.42.43

Protests

Warning / penalties will be given according to Current ISSF Official Status Rules and Regulations. Protests will be handled by the Jury [Cost 50.00]

Non-medical use of drugs (including tobacco and vaping products per the SFC Code of Conduct), or consumption of alcohol is not permitted anywhere on range property. Random doping tests for any competitor are possible at any time. Please see the SFC website for SFC Policy on Doping in Sport.

Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) may conduct anti-doping testing and controls at these Championships. Participation in this competition constitutes a willingness to undergo testing if selected. (Reference I.S.S.F. Anti-Doping Rules item 5.6.5)



2023 SFC High Performance Selection Criteria (online document [here](#))

High Performance Junior Team eligible athletes are those who have met the performance criteria for the 2023 High Performance Program and are under the age of 21 as of December 31, 2023.

To be eligible for the 2023 High Performance you must attend your appropriate discipline's National Championships, the High Performance Team Trials, and one other event you are eligible to achieve your score at.

If you wish for Skeet National Championships to count for score towards the 2023 High Performance Team you must submit a QSDR Form to the High Performance Portal (<https://hp.sfc-ftc.ca/>) and outline if you would like the first course of fire, second course of fire, or both to count for score. QSDR submission deadline is **July 17**, 30 days before the event begins.

The following documents must be signed and presented with your event registration form

- 2022 Event vaccine policy wavier
- SFC Junior participant assumption of risk wavier
- SFC Participant wavier
- Photo waiver (if provided)

Qualify for 2022 National Champions [Total Number of Targets is 250 targets shot in 4 days (75+50) (75+50) Plus ISSF Finals]

Squadding shall be completed by observed random draw by the shotgun Jury for all events. Top 8 highest –ranking competitors after qualification rounds in all Skeet events (including Men, Women, Men junior Women Junior) will be invited to participate in the finals providing numbers permitting.

Procedures specified in current ISSF shotgun rules for skeet (Section 9.10) unless otherwise specified in these rules. [Valid as of 01.01.2022]

- **Only Canadian citizens will be eligible**

Awards

Awards will be presented by the CISSA Section after the competition has concluded.

Entry Process

Please fill out the registration form (Appendix B) and submit at the Pre-Event Training.

Membership

Canadian competitors must be members of the Shooting Federation of Canada in good standing. This will be verified by SFC National Office prior to the match. Everyone must be able to provide proof of membership upon registration.

SFC Memberships is required:

To be eligible for the 2022 Canadian Champions (Men, Women and Junior) and 2022 Junior team selection.

- **SFC Membership is not required of USA Participants**
